Monday 01 July

We welcomed Tina Hadley- Barrows.

Tina came to talk about the Arthritis
research carried out by Keele
University. She advised us that at the
present it takes 17 years for research to
be implemented, this is far too long,
many people will never benefit by new
discoveries. Keele University are
trying to get this reduced to 17 months,
still a long time, but a great

improvement on 17 years. There is also a Patients Voice Group, which was established in 2006. Keele's arthritis and musculoskeletal research team have recently secured funding for a further 4 years, to look at musculoskeletal conditions which includes low back pain, osteoarthritis, inflammatory arthritis, gout and rarer conditions such as lupus.

Keele University have an App for phones, to monitor Pain / Flares, showing times day or night when your pain increases, show this to your GP who will then be able to help you manage and control your pain more effectively. You can download Free from the App Store. They also have Osteoarthritis booklets designed by patients on their website. Leaflets shown on the one enclosed plus one on Back Pain are available on the website. There are far too many for me to enclose with the newsletter, however, if you do not have internet access and would like a leaflet please let me know and I will print a copy for you.
