The new service is now called **Advice Line** and is manned by Nurses on a rota system. This new answering machine telephone advice line will be operated between 10am and 12 midday Monday to Friday.

- 1) Appointments
- 2) Flare up/depo request
- 3) Biologics
- 4) Medication query
- 5) Other

He asks for £3.40 so he can prove the delivery has been made to an adult as there is alcohol in it. He can't take cash as the transaction has to be provable so he produces a hand held card reader. Unless you know who it is from beware of unexpected deliveries.

On Tuesday 24 November I attended the Clued UP Event at Blakenhall Community Centre. It was a lively and busy event giving lots of useful information. I am very pleased to say that our group are already familiar with a lot of the services the authority has to offer. 'How clued up are we! ' Lisa Morgan, who has already introduced us to the Handy Man Service, Keeping warm in our homes, gas boiler services and more, was there to tell everyone about the Care Act 2014. There is a service to suit all. The council will provide help and support for you to stay as independent as possible for as long as possible, in your home, or support you to move to a more suitable home / accommodation for your needs. They can assess your home and make alterations to make staying there easier for you, such as walk in showers, hand rails, stair lifts. Should you want to move they can assist and support you in doing so, this does not always mean going into a home, it may be moving to a smaller more accessible property.

The Wellbeing team were there to remind us to eat healthy and have our 5 a day fruit and veg, look out for sugar contents on packages and sorry to say, drink less alcohol. I have also picked up some news for diabetics, as well as almond nuts being good for you, we can now eat a handful of walnuts. (If I measure them out in my husband's hand I get more!! I for one, am going to have a good Christmas.) I did not qualify for the short 'Health Check' for diabetes, high blood pressure, and high cholesterol because I already have all of those, but hey, I did qualify to complete a 'Healthy Minds Check' you will be pleased to hear, I am not suicidal.
